## IF YOU HAVE TIME?

Visit York Minster, the largest and most complete medieval cathedral in Northern Europe.

The Minster site has been continuously occupied for the past 2000 years (visit the Undercroft Museum to experience the history of the site from Roman to current times), where the original wooden church that stood on the site was built for the baptism of King Edwin of Northumbria on Easter day, 627 AD. The site of that early Christian church is still marked in the Minster crypt. The present gothic style cathedral was built between 1220 to 1480.

If you feel up to it, climb the 275 steps of the Minster Tower for unrivalled views of the surrounding district
