

Information for Authors – Aggregation Induced Emission: Faraday Discussion

Each speaker at a Faraday Discussion meeting must submit a manuscript for publication.

Nature and content of a Faraday Discussion paper

A Faraday Discussion paper **must contain a significant amount of new and unpublished research**. Review-type articles are NOT accepted and the paper must not contain more review material than is necessary to set the context for the novel work. A Discussion paper differs from a typical research paper only in that some remarks or questions that may stimulate interesting scientific discussion may be included. Faraday Discussions are not conference proceedings.

Submission of manuscripts

The deadline for submission of research papers is 27 June 2016. This deadline must be met. The Discussion papers have to meet a very strict timetable so that the papers can be processed and circulated to participants well before the meeting. If you are unable to submit your paper by the deadline please let us know as soon as possible.

As a guide, Faraday Discussion papers can be between 5000 and 8000 words of text plus tables and figures, or 8-15 pages. The corresponding author will receive an email invitation to upload the article via the Faraday Discussions ScholarOne website. Authors should use the link in the email to submit their manuscript on or before the submission deadline. [MS Word and LaTeX templates](#) are available online (although their use is not compulsory). Authors must abide by the [Ethical Guidelines](#) set out by the Royal Society of Chemistry.

Attending the meeting

It is expected that the presenting author will attend the entire Faraday Discussion meeting and give the **5 minute** presentation of the paper highlights. You will be contacted by a member of our Events team with a code for free registration and to arrange your accommodation. Contact chinaEvents@rsc.org for aspects related to attending the meeting.

Refereeing procedure

Members of the Scientific Committee review all submitted papers to ensure that they meet the general guidelines given above.

Licence to publish

The entire Faraday Discussion paper (including tables, figures, diagrams and photographs) and any Electronic Supplementary Information is subject to a [Licence to Publish](#). Authors will be asked to agree to the Licence to Publish online after the manuscript is submitted.

Requirements for revised articles and materials for proof preparation

If revisions have been requested, revised manuscripts should also be sent to the Editorial Office by file-upload to [ScholarOne](#). Please check the manuscript carefully for consistency, particularly in the representation of chemical formulae, compound names and words with alternative spellings.

The papers are typeset and sent out to all of the meeting delegates as preprints one month before the meeting. The proofs are sent to authors shortly after the meeting for corrections. Only typographical corrections are allowed at proof stage. Major revisions can be made only in exceptional circumstances, and with the agreement of the Editor. Please note that authors are responsible for the final proof-reading of manuscripts. It is imperative that authors check the proofs (including any tabulated data and figures) very carefully. All proof corrections should be sent at the same time. Papers are published as Advance Articles on the web as soon as possible after we receive proof corrections from the authors. Late corrections cannot be incorporated after publication of the Advance Article.

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
