


**The Royal Society of Chemistry

Michael will describe and contrast the use of DNA evidence in food analysis and forensic science with some brief case examples, including a manslaughter conviction as a result of an intelligence led screen, the identification of WW1 remains, and LGC's new crime scene DNA instrument. In the major part of the talk Michael will discuss food fraud - what we were looking for when we weren't looking for horse and the history and lessons from the 2013 horsemeat scandal.
