Getting to Birmingham University School of Chemistry

Travelling by train.

It is advised that delegates travel by train to the University of Birmingham. The station itself is 2 stops from New Street Station Birmingham and trains between New Street and the University are very frequent. Access from the University Train Station is easy. The Haworth Building is situated close to the West Gate of the University, a couple of minutes walk from the University Station. (Yellow Zone Building Y2). Driving by car

If you wish to drive limited parking is available on the University campus. The best option is to park in the Pay and Display North East Multi Storey car park (access via Pritchatts Road) Sat Nav Postcode B15 2SA, and walk across the campus from there. Disabled parking spaces can be reserved around the Haworth building, School of Chemistry. If you require this it can be arranged as long as notice is given.

Disabled access to the Haworth building is not a problem – from Haworth carpark, there are no steps to worry about and there are lifts between levels 1-2. The Lecture Theatre 203 has a ramp/lift outside to get to front area of lecture theatre where there is more room. Transfer between Haworth and ChemWest (Labs) can be a bit tricky, but lift access is fine in Chem West if needed.
