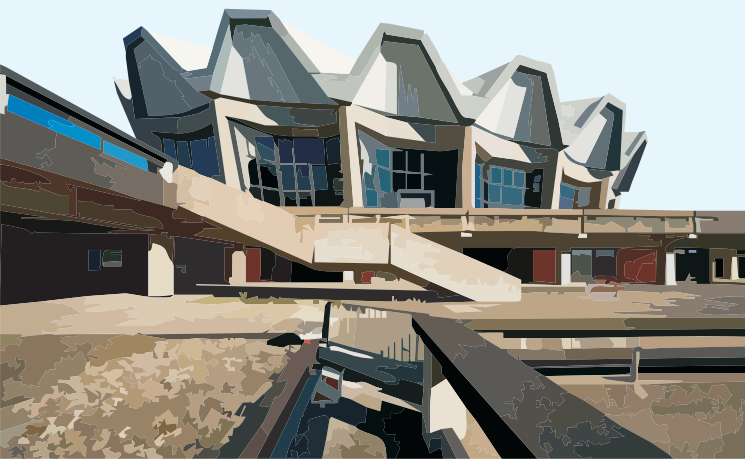


# ISBOMC'10

## Invitation

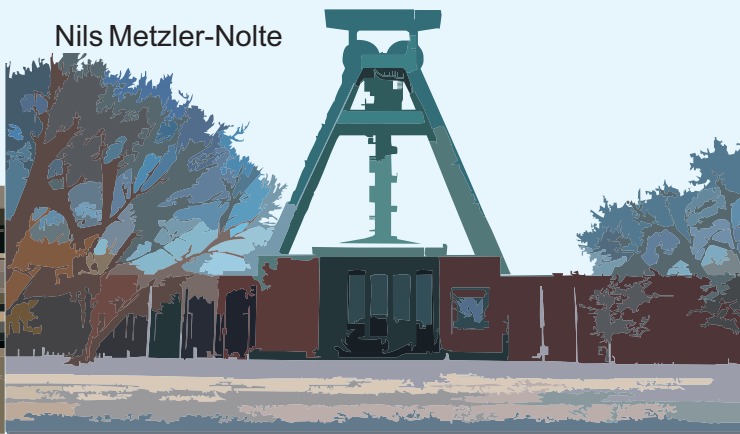

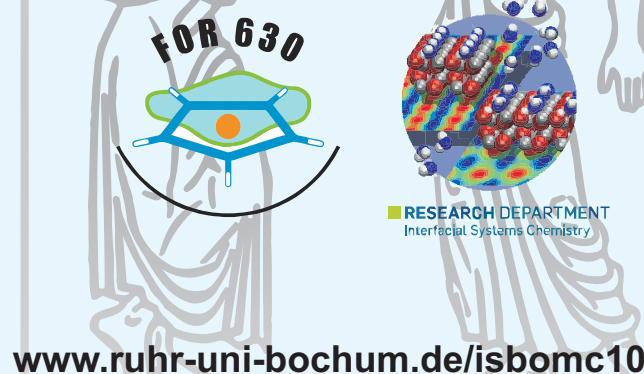
