**1. Minutes of AGM held on 16<sup>th</sup> April 2019**

The minutes were confirmed as correct.

**2. Annual Report of Secretary for 2019-2021**

Membership of the local section has decreased, hopefully due to the pandemic and we will attempt to regrow in the coming years. The lecture program made expansive progress pre-pandemic with fortnightly seminars through the year and hosted RSC award winners and esteemed scientists. There are none currently scheduled.

The outreach program has been the busiest part of the local section. Science and energy lectures were hosted in 2019 by Joel Loveridge and Oscar Chess. Pre pandemic over 4500 school pupils from Years 6 to 13 visited the Chemistry department lab while approximately 1000 students attended the workshops by March 2020. The Chemistry Carnival attended the Waterfront Museum for super science Sunday in March 2020. The lockdown that began in March 2020 resulted in the cancellation of all events planned for the rest of the academic year (3 lab-based contests, 17 schools booked for lab visits, 12 workshops).

Top of the bench was hosted in an online format in 2020 and 2021 with 37 schools competing and us providing winners for both West and East Wales.

Chemical Analyst competition was hosted online in 2021 with a simulated redox titration. 244 pupils from 21 schools took part.

In 2022 we hosted a number of A level days. 231 students (224 unique) from 25 schools took part in the days carrying out 1126 experiments. As always these were very well received. Financially the RSC local section provides schools transportation grants in addition to central RSC outreach grants.

**3. Annual Report of Treasurer for 2019-2021**

The audited accounts were supplied by the Treasurer and showed the balance at year end of £6838. This is very high due to lack of activity and spending during the pandemic.

Therefore, the committee agreed to increase engagement to subsidise the cost of the AGM Meal for members at an expected cost of £1700. A call was made for any projects that may require one off funding. The Harry Hallam memorial fund stands at £3126

**5. Any other business.**

1. Call for any science outreach stalls at the Broadlands Fun Fair in Bridgend on Sat Sep 3<sup>rd</sup>
2. R Owen is running for the RSC Inclusion and Diversity Committee
3. The committee was delighted by the high attendance at the AGM with a record 55 attendees to the AGM or meal.

3. S Bott provided the table with a set of questions for discussion on how to reactivate the local section after the pandemic with the aims:

- a) To organise and financially support a thriving programme of talks associated with the chemical science-related work being conducted in the area. We hosted Prof. Yang Yang right before COVID and were set to host Matt Beard. The new programme would include similar RSC award winners but also local speakers – both residents and visitors.
- b) To reactivate the “Science and Energy” lecture series for Year 6 students, incorporating increased discussion of “alternative” sources of energy. This will provide opportunities for members interested in teaching as well as possible impact examples for researchers.
- c) To organise and to host special interest groups for seminars, discussions, talks and even joint research projects
- d) To lead and to support efforts to increase the equality, diversity and inclusivity within the local chemical science community.
- e) To collaborate with the South Wales East section in efforts associated with points (a), (c ) and (d).
