CHEMISTS' COMMUNITY FUND REPORT

The role of the Kent Local Section CCF Co-ordinator has evolved in recent years, as most activities are now organized, centrally, by the Fund Office in Cambridge. A flavour of the Fund's activities, nationally, in 2022 is given below:

1779 people and their families received support from the Fund under the CCF primary purpose in 2022

There were 364 new enquiries for help and support There were 110 calls to the new Wellbeing and Listening Service 1,050 people attended a Fund workshop 241 members attended an online workshop on Transforming Sleep £6,100 was the largest grant £44 was the smallest grant 110 individual counselling sessions were funded 59 members were proactively contacted in Ukraine following the outbreak of war to remind them of CCF support 117 members were directly contacted following severe weather events around the world to remind them of CCF support 17 volunteer visits or phone calls took place to support members

10 members regularly received an accessible Talking Chemistry World
