

1. Style

MedChemComm Reviews are easy-to-read articles covering current areas of interest for a medicinal chemistry audience. They are a concise and critical appraisal of an area in medicinal chemistry or a related topic. Also welcome are reviews which focus on topics outside of traditional medicinal chemistry but which have application in medicinal chemistry, particularly new technologies (e.g. nanotechnology). Reviews should focus on the key developments that have shaped the topic, rather than comprehensive reviews of the literature. Since the readership of *MedChemComm* is wide-ranging, the article should be accessible to a non-specialist in the field. At the same time, they should provide an authoritative discussion of the area concerned. Authors are encouraged to include their own perspective on developments, trends and future directions, particularly identifying areas where further developments are imminent or that are in urgent need of being addressed.

The Editorial team also welcome shorter “commentary” or “opinion” style articles, which focus on a particular issue of importance to the community. If you are interested in writing an article of this type please contact the Editorial office.

2. Length

MedChemComm Reviews will typically be 6-15 printed pages in length (ca. 15-35 pages of double spaced typescript); however these are not strict limits and the Editorial Office would be happy to consider shorter or longer articles. Authors should include illustrative material (tables and figures) as they consider appropriate. 3. Format

The format requirements are broadly the same as for a Concise Article for *MedChemComm*. Please note that authors are responsible for obtaining the permission necessary for the reproduction of figures from other sources (normally permission is required from the publisher). 4. Colour

The use of colour is encouraged. Reproduction in colour is free online, and is free in print where it enhances understanding.

5. Graphical Abstract

Please include an illustrated contents entry including: graphic: 8cm x 4cm, preferably in colour; text: one sentence no longer than 30 words, highlighting the most interesting parts of the manuscript.

6. Biographic Sketch and Photograph

A brief biography should be included for the principal author and up to five other authors. Each biography should be confined to 100 words. Please also provide black and white photographs of the authors (4 cm wide x 5 cm high, at a resolution of 600 dpi). For further information, please contact the editorial office.
