

#### **1. Style**

These are easy-to-read articles covering current areas of interest for a broad medicinal chemistry audience. They are a concise and critical appraisal of an area in medicinal chemistry or a related topic, typically 8-12 pages in length. Particularly welcome are reviews which focus on topics outside of traditional medicinal chemistry but which have application in medicinal chemistry, particularly new technologies. Reviews should focus on the key developments that have shaped the topic, rather than comprehensive reviews of the literature. Authors are encouraged to include their own perspective on developments, trends and future directions, particularly identifying areas where further developments are imminent or that are in urgent need of being addressed. Please note that Reviews should include balanced coverage of the field and not focus predominantly on the author's own research.

#### **2. Format**

The format requirements are broadly the same as for a Concise Article for *MedChemComm*. #### **3. Colour**

The use of colour is encouraged and provided free of charge.

#### **4. Graphical Abstract**

Please include an illustrated contents entry including: graphic: 8cm x 4cm, preferably in colour; text: one sentence no longer than 30 words, highlighting the most interesting parts of the manuscript.

#### **5. Biographic Sketch and Photograph**

A brief biography should be included for the principal author and up to five other authors. Each biography should be confined to 100 words. Please also provide black and white photographs of the authors (4 cm wide x 5 cm high, at a resolution of 600 dpi). For further information, please contact the editorial office.
