Comments	NWAD holds an annual Christmas Lecture and Buffet. Our 7 <sup>th</sup> lecture was held at the end of November 2016 and attracted around 70 members and guests who enjoyed an informative and entertaining talk by Tony Bristow and two colleagues entitled "Made to be measured: the revolutions in analytical science for the real time analysis of the human body". Following the lecture, the speakers and audience congregated for a meal during which there was plenty of lively conversation.

Event Name	H2OWatch (formerly Streamwatch)

Comments	NWAD has re-branded our Streamwatch activities as H2OWatch to reflect the excellent outreach work undertaken by staff and students at Manchester Metropolitan Univeristy in developing our Streamwatch kits and promoting their use amongst schools in our region and abroad. This project encourages youngsters to perform chemical analysis using simple analytical test kits which can be taken into the field to measure parameters such as pH, nitrate, dissolved oxygen, hardness, turbidity and temperature and thus provide information on the health of local streams and ponds. The kits have also been used to raise public awareness on the value of chemistry at the Manchester Science Festival, and staff at the Catalyst Science and Discovery Centre (Widnes) have been trained to use the kits so that H2OWatch is now incorporated into their workshops and science clubs for visiting schools and community groups.



## **AWARDS AND BURSARIES**

NWAD has for many years provided <u>Travel Grants</u> to post-graduate students wishing to participate in analytical conferences, and to schools wishing to visit local universities and colleges to find out more about analytical science.

Recent travel grants have been awarded to:

**Gemma Hardman**, a post-graduate student at Liverpool University, who received a grant to attend the American Society for Mass Spectrometry Conference held in Texas in June 2016 at which she presented a poster on her research work.

**Aamar Khan**, a final year post-graduate student at Manchester Metropolitan University, who received a grant to attend the 5th International Conference on Multifunctional, Hybrid and Nanomaterials held in Lisbon in March 2017 at which he presented a paper on his research work.

NWAD also sponsors <u>Summer Studentships</u> which enable young scientists to work for several weeks alongside experienced chemists at universities in our region and thus gain valuable research experience at the start of their careers. In 2016 we provided funding to enable a student to work on "Ion Mobility Mass Spectrometry for Sizing Molecules - an investigation of the use of rigid systems for calibration of flexibility" for 6 weeks at Manchester University; and for a student to work on "Analysis of a fruit extract to identify actives that stimulate uterus contractions" for 8 weeks at Liverpool University.
