

Guidelines for Authors

1. Style

Organic & Biomolecular Chemistry Perspectives are short, easy-to-read articles covering current areas of interest for a synthetic, physical or biomolecular organic chemistry audience. They may take the form of a concise and critical appraisal or a personal viewpoint of activity in a specialist area. By their nature they will not be comprehensive reviews of a field of organic or biomolecular chemistry.

Since the readership of *Organic & Biomolecular Chemistry* is wide-ranging, the article should be easily understandable to a non-specialist in the field. At the same time, they should provide an authoritative discussion of the area concerned. Authors are encouraged to identify areas where further developments are imminent, in urgent need of being addressed, and any areas that may be of significance to the organic or biomolecular chemistry communities in general. A Perspective should not solely be a review of the author's own work, but should cover key developments from across the field.

Organic & Biomolecular Chemistry Perspectives will generally be refereed by a member of the Editorial Board/Advisory Board or a senior referee.

2. Length

An *Organic & Biomolecular Chemistry Perspective* will typically be 10-12 printed pages in length (ca. 30 pages of double spaced typescript) although longer perspectives could be considered. Authors should include illustrative material (tables and figures) as they consider appropriate. The number of references should not usually exceed 100. Article templates can be found at

3. Format

The format requirements are broadly the same as for a regular paper for *Organic & Biomolecular Chemistry*. Please note that authors are responsible for obtaining the permission necessary for the reproduction of figures from other sources (normally permission is required from the publisher). 4. Colour

The use of colour is encouraged and, where it helps to communicate scientific ideas, is provided free of charge.

5. Graphical Abstract

Please include an illustrated contents entry including: graphic: 8cm x 4cm, preferably in colour; text: one sentence no longer than 30 words, highlighting the most interesting parts of the manuscript.

6. Biographic Sketch and Photograph

A brief biography should be included for the principal author and up to five other authors. Each biography should be confined to 100 words. Please also provide black and white photographs of the authors (4 cm wide x 5 cm high, at a resolution of 600 dpi).
