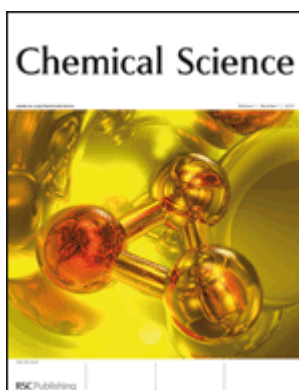


2010 Subscriptions

Is your organisation registered for free access to our new journals? We have successfully launched 5 new titles in 2008/9, with three more to follow in 2010. Your institution can have access to **all of them for free** by simply registering at the link below. The titles include

Important news for *ChemComm* and *Dalton Transactions* subscribers

These journals were not assigned volume numbers when first published, and we have found that this causes problems for customers, in particular with online links to journal articles. Volume numbers will be added, beginning with issue 1, 2010. Previous volumes published before 2010 will not be numbered retrospectively.

- *ChemComm* will start from volume 46 in 2010 Issue 1 (Issues for 1965-2009 have no volume numbering).
- *Dalton Transactions* will start from volume 39 in 2010 Issue 1 (Issues for 1972-2009 have no volume numbering).
