

Nature & purpose Highlight Articles in *Soft Matter* are short articles that highlight important new developments made over the past year or so. They should explain the significance of the work to the broad, interdisciplinary *Soft Matter* audience. They may point out further urgent follow-up work and challenges that are still faced, and may be speculative in nature. No new work should be presented; these papers are intended to put existing work into perspective.

Length Highlight Articles should be 4 journal pages (manuscript length of around 12-16 double-spaced pages), although this may vary slightly depending on the nature of the article. Authors should include displayed material (tables and figures) as they consider appropriate.

Abstract A short “snappy” summary should open the article. This should be approximately 100 words long.

Biography & photograph A brief biography should be included, a maximum of 100 words per author. Each biography should also include one photo (black and white). There can be a maximum of 6 individual biographies per article.

Electronic Supplementary Information (ESI): ESI is a free facility that enables authors to enhance and increase the impact of their articles. Such data can take full advantage of the electronic medium, allowing use of full colour diagrams, 3D molecular models, movie clip files etc. Authors are encouraged to use this service to enhance their Highlight Articles.

Templates Highlight articles are formatted in 3 columns, not 2 which are used in the generic RSC article template.

Copyright If Authors need to reproduce any illustrations, tables or quotations from another source then it is the Author’s responsibility to obtain written permissions from the copyright owner (normally permission is required from the publisher). A permission request form for this purpose is available at the RSC web site (<http://www.rsc.org/AboutUs/Copyright/Permissionrequests.asp>). This should be submitted along with the manuscript. It is also the author’s responsibility to ensure the correct acknowledgements are given in their article.

Acceptance At least two independent experts will referee all Highlight Articles. The decision to accept (or reject) an article will be made on the basis of two agreeing reports. Suggestions for appropriate reviewers are welcomed. Authors may be required to make some alterations to their manuscript before it is passed for editing.

Reprints Corresponding authors will receive a PDF reprint of their article and a copy of the printed issue in which their Highlight Article appears. Printed reprints may be ordered on request from the Editorial Office.
