The Duncan Bryant Memorial Prize

When their Chairman died in 2005 the committee of the Molecular Spectroscopy Group decided that they would find a appropriate way of recording their gratitude to him and their affection for him. The result is the **Duncan Bryant Memorial Prize** for young analytical chemists working or studying in the pharmaceutical sector.

The inaugural event for this prize will take place on 15th May 2008 at the GSK lecture theatre in Stevenage, when a selected group of young chemists will present lectures on topics in pharmaceutical analysis. The prize will be awarded by a small committee for the “best” presentation taking into account scientific interest, preparation of the lecture and clarity of its presentation. An invited over-view lecture on analytical spectroscopy in the pharmaceutical sector will be presented by Dr Mike Webb, while the competition winner is determined.

The prize has been commissioned and presented by Duncan’s former employers, GlaxoSmithKline and is a picture representing different aspects of Duncan’s professional and personal life. The winner will receive a framed print of the picture to retain in perpetuity. The Molecular Spectroscopy Group would like to express their appreciation to GlaxoSmithKline for their generosity in presenting the picture and hosting the inaugural event.
