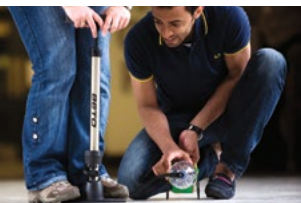

COURSE OVERVIEW



These four day residential courses are designed to provide teachers with case studies that they can use in contextual teaching of both science and design technology. They bring together teachers from both disciplines so that you have the opportunity to meet in an informal environment to exchange views on the teaching of this cross curricular subject.



They are designed to improve your knowledge and understanding of the aspects of the curriculum relating to polymers in order to encourage more confident teaching and raise achievement. The courses provide valuable teaching resources relating to the curriculum and promote the knowledge of polymers and their importance to the quality of everyday life and therefore enhance the image of plastics and the plastics industry in the eyes of future consumers.



The course gives you the unique opportunity to visit major plastics processing companies and to attend lectures and discussions with leading figures from industry and academia. There are sessions in the laboratories where you can operate machines to make and collect samples to take back to school and use test equipment.

The Tours have been approved for Professional Development by

the Institute of Materials and Mining and teachers who complete the course will receive a Certificate of Attendance for their portfolio.

These courses were initiated by the Worshipful Company of Horners in 1987 and they are still the major sponsor. The BPF (British Plastics Federation), the leading voice in the UK plastics industry are also strong supporters of the Tours.

Although the running costs work out at around £850 per person the course is FREE to attend and we are able to offer all delegates a bursary of up to £200 towards travel or cover costs.

The Horners' Educational Trust and generous sponsorship by companies and organisations provide all the necessary funding. All we ask for is a £50 booking deposit to secure your place. This is refunded after you have attended the course.

TYPICAL PROGRAMME

Day 1 Starts Sunday afternoon to allow travel to the venue

- Introduction to the course and plastics industry
- Education support from the Institute of Materials Minerals and Mining
- Dinner followed by an informal ice-breaker event

Day 2

- Lectures on Polymer Materials and Applications
- Workshop in the labs including hands-on processing and testing
- Dinner with guest lecture from local industrialist or academic

Day 3

- Industrial visits to local plastics processing companies
- Course dinner with short speech by an Officer from the Worshipful Company of Horners

Day 4 Course closes by 16:00 allowing for travel arrangements

- Practical on polymer identification and testing
- Lectures on History and Design of Polymer Products, Sustainable Environment, Polymer Industry and Support for Schools
- Final session – evaluation, development and improvement

The courses are closely linked to the science and design technology curriculum and provide real life contexts for your teaching.

A USB memory stick of course materials and additional literature to increase your knowledge further is provided after the course on receipt of a letter of thanks to your sponsor.
