All delegates

- ✓ **10th September:** Registration and welcoming reception will take place at the [SS Great Britain Museum](#), Great Western Dockyard, Gas Ferry Road, Bristol BS1 6TY. The reception starts at 18.00, but the museum and registration desk will be open from 17.30.
- ✓ **11th September:** Technical sessions will take place at the [Wills Memorial Building](#) of the University of Bristol, Queens Rd, Bristol BS8 1RJ. Registrations starts at 8.00 and technical sessions from 8.45.
- ✓ **11th September:** The meeting banquet will take place at the [Bristol Museum & Art Gallery](#), Queens Road, Bristol BS8 1RL. Welcoming drinks and visit to the Ancient Egypt Gallery start at 19.00.
- ✓ **12th September:** Technical sessions starts at 9.00, concluding at 17.00.

- ✓ Invited and contributed papers are scheduled for 15 minutes with additional 5 minutes for discussions and change over.

Registration and Welcoming Reception

Date: Sunday 10th September

Time: 18.00 – 20.00. Museum and registration open from 17.30.

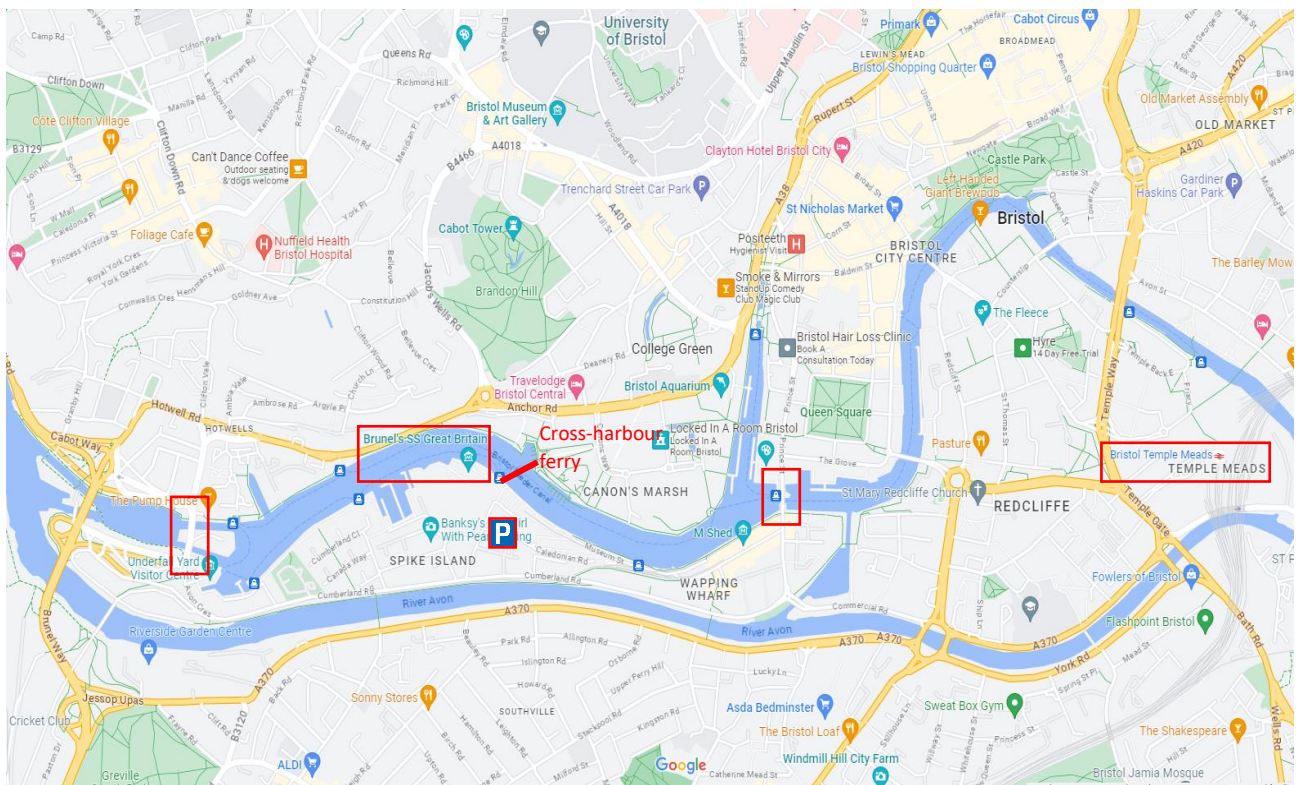
What: Drinks and canapes on the deck of this historic boat. They are also opening up the SS Great Britain museum up for us, which can be accessed from 17.30. This is a brilliant museum that teaches you about the interesting and varied history of the boat. It normally costs a lot to enter, so this is a great opportunity to see this historic jewel in the heart of Bristol city centre.

It will be possible to store your luggage here during the event if you are arriving directly.

Venue Address: Brunel's SS Great Britain, Great Western Dockyard, Gas Ferry Road, Bristol, GS1 6TY

Venue Access: Entrance will be through The Dockyard Museum, accessed via the Great Western Dockyard Gate, located on the left of the Harbourside Kitchen Café.

Transport: The closest train station is Bristol Temple Meads, which is about a 30-minute walk away along Bristol's Floating Harbour. If required to cross the harbour, there are two bridges at either end, or alternatively the cross-harbour ferry runs between Hanover Quay and Brunel's SS Great Britain but only until 5.30 pm on Sundays. The venue is also accessible by car, and parking is available at the Maritime Heritage Centre pay and display car park.



Technical Sessions

Date: Monday 11th and Tuesday 12th September

Time: Monday 8.45 – 18.00, registration from 8.00. Tuesday 9.00 – 17.00.

Venue Address: Wills Memorial Building, University of Bristol, Queens Road, Bristol, BS8 1RJ

There will be a cloakroom available on both days.

Transport: The closest train station is Bristol Temple Meads, which is 1.2 miles and a 25-minute walk away from the venue. There are several bus services which stop a short walk away from the Wills Memorial Building: services 1, 2, 2a, 8 and 72 all run from Temple Meads train station and services 3 and 4 run from the city centre (alight at Park Street Top).
