Chemistry Week November 9<sup>th</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup>

On behalf of the RSC Mid Scotland section and the SCI Scotland section, I am writing to ask if your school would like to participate in an event we are running for primary schools in the Trossachs area. We have engaged a presenter to deliver an event based on the theme of the RSC Chemistry Week for this year – Food, with the target audience being P5, P6 and P7 pupils.
