St. Andrews and its University

St. Andrews is a beautiful mediaeval town on the sea-shore 50 miles (80 km) north of Edinburgh. It boasts spectacular beaches and is the home of golf – there are 6 courses close to the conference venue including the world famous Old Course. Hill walking in the highlands is little more than an hour away, as are malt whisky distilleries.

The University was founded by a Bull of Pope Benedict XIII in 1413 so the conference is held in the year in which we celebrate the 600th Anniversary. Some of the buildings date back almost to the foundation.

Conference Venue

The conference will be held in the brand new Medical School, which has ample lecture theatre space, room for posters, exhibitions and social space. Participants will be accommodated in New Hall, just 5 minutes walk from the conference venue. All rooms have double beds with en-suite facilities, television, computer access and telephones.

By Road

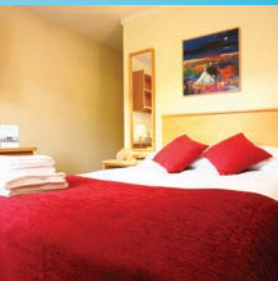
St Andrews is 50 miles north of Edinburgh via the Forth Bridge to junction 2A on M90, then A92 through Glenrothes, A914 to Cupar and A91 to St Andrews. It is 15 miles south of Dundee via the Tay Bridge, A92, A914 and A91. Glasgow is 75 miles away via either M8 to the Forth Bridge or by M80 and M876 to the Kincardine Bridge and then by A977, M90 and A91.

By Rail

Leuchars railway station is on the east coast main line with connections throughout Britain and a night sleeper service to London. The station is 4 miles from St Andrews from which there is an excellent taxi service and a frequent local bus service.

By Air

Edinburgh is the nearest major airport to St Andrews and is one hour's drive away. Glasgow airport has direct flights to the United States and Canada and is one and a half hour's drive away.
