

# BREWERY TOUR SAFETY REGULATIONS

Your Brewery Tour Guide will explain all the safety regulations before the tour commences. You should be aware that there are many potential hazards in the brewery and all members of the group should be reminded of the following. This includes Food Safety as well as Health and Safety.

- Visitors will be required to comply with the Health and Safety Regulations and any Company safety rules which may be in force, and must at all times remain with their guide.
- The Brewery is classified as food production premises under the Food & Hygiene Regulations and, as such, we must ask visitors to refrain from smoking and eating (including the chewing of gum) while on the Brewery production premises. We are a nut free site so no food with or traces of nuts are to be brought onto site.
- There is a small but discernible risk of contamination of our products during processing and packaging from medicine brought inside our company. If you are carrying any kind of medicaments with you, please inform our staff and we will be pleased to provide an appropriate place to store it.
- If you are suffering or have been in contact with any infectious diseases, do not enter production
- We are proud of our site; please help us to maintain housekeeping standards by using waste bins, which are provided around site.
- Washrooms and toilets are provided. Please use these facilities in the appropriate manner and help us to maintain cleanliness in these areas. Wash hands after use.
- Use the sanitiser dispense on entrance to production to clean your hands.
- If applicable, be aware of vehicle movements around you at all times
- In the unlikely event of a fire, fire alarm or other emergency while the visit is taking place the evacuated the building through your nearest exit. Please note that all exits may be used, and are clearly marked. All visitors to assemble in the Brewery carpark.
- Please note that flat shoes with a good non-slip sole would be advisable, as floors are often wet. Please be aware of trailing hoses and stacked casks and boxes. Also, could we ask ladies NOT to wear high-heeled shoes, as, apart from damaging the floors in the Brewery, they could be very dangerous. During the winter months we advise visitors to wear warm clothing, as the Brewery can be very cold.
- We regret that the premises do not lend themselves to visitors who have any mobility issues as there are a number of steep stairways around the brewery, as well as numerous potential trip hazards.
- Please note that we reserve the right to refuse anyone deemed unfit/intoxicated. Any inappropriate behaviour will also not be tolerated to ensure the safety of our staff and customers.
- We are unable to accommodate anyone under the age of 18 years.
- We do not accept third party liability.
