Practical, hands-on projects are desirable.

If possible, projects should be sustainable (i.e. equipment could be used in subsequent years).

Unfortunately funding *cannot be used* for transport, prizes, photocopying, subsistence, normal curriculum topics, cameras or supply cover.

We will allocate funding by end of October 2019.

We would expect activities completed and the posters/evidence to be submitted by end of April 2020 in order for us to display at the RSC Nigel Botting Teachers' Meeting in mid-May.
