Other speakers are selected based on the quality of abstracts. At all our events since my membership of CBBG, at least 30% (and usually more) of the other speakers have been female. We have also decided recently that we will only sponsor events where the gender balance of the speakers at least reflects that of CBBG members (ca. 23% female) with the aim to be as close to 50:50 as possible.
