BRSG-NMRDG Annual Prize for Excellent Contribution to Magnetic Resonance by an Early Career Researcher

Terms of reference:

The prize is awarded for excellence in magnetic resonance and is to honour a work representing one or more substantial contributions to the field. The prize is to be awarded jointly by the BRSG (Institute of Physics Magnetic Resonance society) and the NMR Discussion Group of the Royal Society of Chemistry on an annual basis.

Eligibility:

The awardee can be of any nationality, but is to be based in the UK or Ireland at the time of nomination and award. The research being recognised can have been partially but not exclusively carried out outside the UK or Ireland.

The prize will be awarded to an early career researcher, defined as those individuals in the first 12 years of a research career (allowing for career breaks), e.g. following the award of a PhD.

The awardee cannot be a current committee member of the BRSG or the NMR Discussion Group. The recipient need not be a member of the IOP BRSG: The Magnetic Resonance Group or the NMR Discussion Group.

Nomination Procedure:

Candidates for the award need to nominated (and seconded) by a member of the BRSG or the NMR Discussion Group. A short case is to be made as to why the candidate is suitable for a prize recognising excellence in magnetic resonance, including reference to one or more substantial contributions to the field.

Selection Procedure:

The Prize will be awarded by a committee made up of two representatives from the BRSG and two representatives from the NMR Discussion Group of the Royal Society of Chemistry. A majority decision of the prize committee is required.
