Figure S1 below shows UPS spectra measured under conditions described in the main text for an asloaded bilayer film in comparison. The changes in inelastic background intensity and secondary electron cut-off near 16 eV bindin energy are consistent with the removal of weakly phyisorbed ambient contaminants that slightly change the surface dipole layer.


